## **Speech and Listening**

### **January 2026**

Zechariah 13:9 "...They will call on my name and I will answer them; I will say "They are my people, 'and they will say, 'the Lord is our God.'"

Psalms 100:4 "Enter his gates with Thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."

Isaiah 51:4 "Listen to me, my people; hear me, my nation: Instruction will go out from me; my justice will become a light to the nations."

And during the Saturday Women's Bible study (10:00 a.m. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of the month) we have wonderful discussions about the book we are reading and the coinciding scriptures. My goal for 2026 is to read through the King James version of the Bible, I am currently completing my goal of reading the Message version using the Bible app on my ipad. It is a great app because I can see the words and listen to them in a daily plan.

Let's keep listening, talking with one another, and receiving.

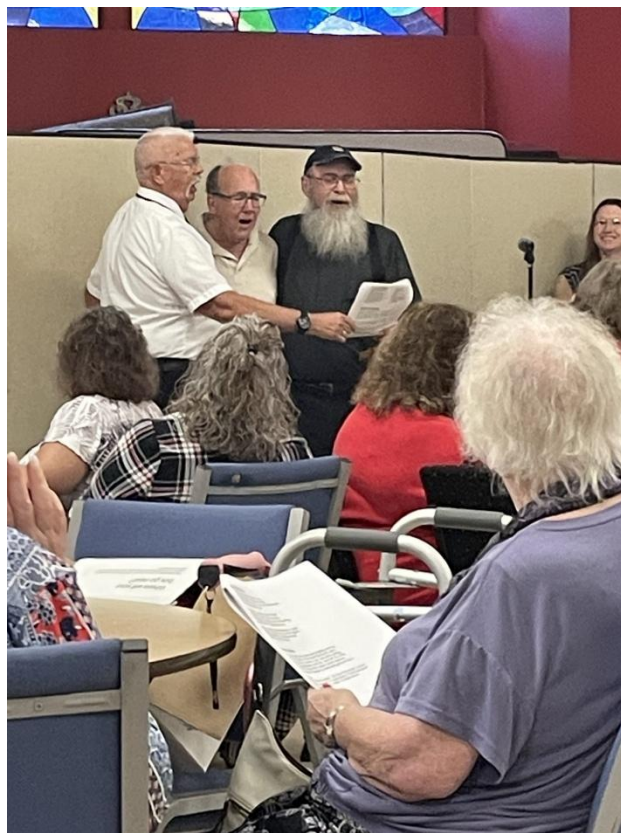
## **CHOIR NEWS**

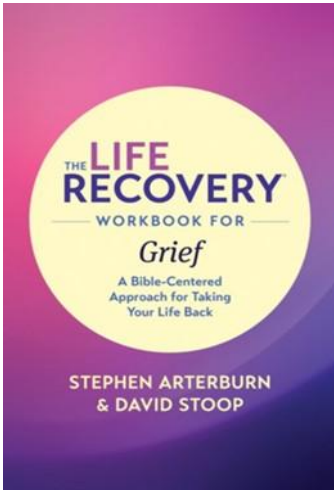
Come one, come all and make a joyful noise to the Lord! Come on in and join us! I am sure you will know the hymns.

## The second Sunday of each month is Mites Sunday

Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" — offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars that fund district and national [mission grants](#) and implement the LWML program.



[Mite Boxes](#), are distributed to every woman in a society, and to each member of the congregation. Local groups submit Mite Box offerings to the appointed district officer.

### The Widow's Mite

*Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts.*

*But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ## CHRIST-CENTERED HOPE FOR CANCER PATIENTS

PHIL'S FRIENDS | \$100,000



### *Visiting Cancer Patients with the Compassion of Jesus*

Phil's Friends touches or "visits" cancer patients and their families in profound ways. In the past 18 years, nearly 60,000 care packages and more than one million Cards of Hope were sent across the United States and even to Liberia. Each cancer patient can't be seen in person, but they can be "visited" with the mercy, love, and compassion of Jesus Christ through free care packages and monthly Cards of Hope. It is during difficult times when people are most likely to ask searching questions and are open to the Gospel. Simple acts of kindness, such as receiving a care package or encouraging cards, become the most meaningful and impactful.

The cost to support one cancer patient for a year is \$100. This total includes the care package, 12 Cards of Hope, and postage. Since Phil's Friends is 100% donor supported, this \$100,000 grant will help reach 1000 patients with Christ-centered hope and compassion.

Each care package is lovingly hand-decorated, and the contents are customized according to the age and gender of the recipient. Care packages are filled with both practical and comfort items that a cancer patient can use during their treatments such as lip balm, a water bottle, lotion, a knitted hat, socks, a homemade blanket, a journal, puzzle books, and stuffed animals for children. The most important thing that is included in every package is the Bible, the only true source of hope and comfort.

Phil's Friends operates in the LWML Northern Illinois District, and the Bible verse from Matthew 25:36 is at the core of its mission. Testimonies are received every week from recipients telling how their care package and ongoing Cards of Hope strengthen, encourage, and uplift their spirits. Some recipients say they began reading the Bible for the first time and came to faith in Jesus. Phil's Friends plants Gospel seeds, reaches the spiritually lost, and rejoices over every person who will join Jesus in heaven.

We are writing this somewhat reluctantly, but as this is the time of year when thoughts reflect on the past and contemplate the future, the time has come. Forest Oaks Lutheran Church has been our home for twenty years. Prior to our move to Florida, we lived in Maryland, and many of our family still live there and we are considering a move back to Maryland to be closer to them. Like many who have faced a similar situation, as we are aging, whether we move or not, we find that we are not able to do many of the things we could do when we first arrived here and so, there are things that we need to pass on to others. While we are still here and there's some time for us to aid in the transition, others need to come forward and volunteer to follow in our footsteps. For example, there are bulletin boards at various locations throughout the church building, particularly near the fellowship hall, in need of care. Judy is having issues using a ladder to continue doing them. Since other organizations use our Fellowship Hall, in addition to members and visitors, it is good to have a Christian message for them to see. The food pantry can use a person who is familiar with EXCEL or any computer program that can assist them with tracking the amount of families and people we serve weekly and monthly.

Jess has been the treasurer or assistant treasurer for many years and, although the current assistant is very capable to continue, the church requires another person to help. Having someone volunteer now would enable Jess to help that person learn and be able to assist. Another major need will be someone to coordinate the church services with the Pastor and make the slides to be shown each Sunday as well as during special services. We consider these areas to be those that would benefit from an early transition and training. Please feel free to ask us questions or discuss your concerns about them with us.

We understand that as a somewhat small congregation, there are many things that need to be done and often can overwhelm even the most dedicated among us. We are asking you to prayerfully consider and make the bold step to come forward to fill the empty spaces that we are leaving behind so that we can move forward and you can continue your spiritual journey by serving the Lord, your fellow believers, and our community. Please keep us in your prayers, as you will be in ours. Peace and joy to you in the coming year. *Blessings, Jess and Judy Ward*
